Our mission is to catalyze relationships and unite organizations, practitioners, and experts from Geneva and around the globe to share knowledge, facilitate dialogue, and explore innovative approaches to peace across various disciplines and contexts. As a flagship initiative of the GPP, Geneva Peace Week aims to break down silos between sectors, amplify diverse perspectives, and promote practical solutions to conflict, violence, and insecurity. Since the first edition 2014, GPW has evolved into a pivotal event that connects International Geneva with global peacebuilding efforts.







NO TIME TO DELAY PEACE

The 12th edition of Geneva Peace Week is marked by our theme: "Peace in Action," emphasizing not only innovative approaches, but above all concrete action to consolidate peace in a context where our interactions are increasingly rapid in the face of escalating global tensions. This year's focus encourages participants to relate ideas to tangible impact, fostering the development of effective solutions that are both global and local.

This year's programme features over 100 events, including:



Throughout the week, the Maison de la Paix in Geneva will host free and accessible exhibitions and workshops that amplify diverse voices from around the world, showcasing how artistic expression strengthens resilience and unites us through a shared language of peace. All activities will be open to participants and the public.

Here is a selection on what to expect:

- As part of Geneva Peace Week 2025, Guila Clara Kessous, UNESCO Artist for Peace, actress, and theatre director, will lead an artistic residency exploring the transformative power of theatre in advancing human rights.
- Big Bang! is a theatre performance about the Swedish war time journalist Barbro "Bang" Alving (1909-1987). The play explores what it means to be a pacifist in a time of military escalation and to live an unconventional life in a conservative society, all while highlighting Bang's remarkable legacy as a journalist.
- Come meet artist Erika González and discover her exhibition Asimetrìa at Geneva Peace Week.
- Come meet artist Álvaro Sebastián Quiroz Bolaños and explore his exhibition Echoes of Reality at Geneva Peace Week.
